What are the Right To Care campaign goals?

Right To Care seeks to ensure that families have access to care that is equitable and supports family choice. We want the IL early childhood workforce to have equitable funding and stable resources.

In the long term, the campaign wants to involve more parents, providers, and community members in advocating for improvements in Illinois' early childhood system.
